Name of position: Elected: Position description and main roles:	Crossing Borders Representative At AGM, by secret ballot The Crossing Borders Officer educates students about the topic of refugees and people seeking asylum in Australia by running advocacy campaigns (via social media, at university etc.) and organising relevant speakers and workshops at Insight events. They inspire students to take action in the area of refugee health by facilitating discussion and improving awareness about issues pertinent to the health of refugees and people seeking asylum. They empower students to work towards better health care for refugees and people seeking asylum by facilitating student engagement with advocacy, engaging students in the Crossing Borders subcommittee and encouraging students to attend rallies and Welcome Dinners, upskill and network with other advocates in the field.
	History of role: 2023 was the seventh year that the Crossing Borders for Health state representative held a position on the Insight Committee. Crossing Borders SA was created in 2015 for students to advocate for refugees and people seeking asylum and educate others around pertinent issues and health care for this group. It is a subsidiary of the national group, administered by AMSA Global Health. In 2016 it was made a sub-committee of Insight and in 2017 it was created as an official position.
